
What is it?


A tool library functions similar to a book lending library by offering tools to a community that are no longer dedicated to a single person, but circulated as available.

This model encourages tool sharing and at a lower price point (suggested donation) than either rental or resale.

We expect to expand inventory over time through donations and selective purchases so let us know if you want something not listed, or already checked out.

- Cordless tools are inprocess as we work through lifespan and purchase/maintenan ce issues
- Other/adjacent: car/bike repair, kitchen/small appliances as space permits
